# What types of music periodicals?

- Freely available online
  - Including periodicals from which only selected content is freely available online
    - Digitization might be in progress
    - Certain issues might not be available due to copyright restrictions
- Scholarly, popular, and trade publications

# Something old ... something new

- These criteria include everything from ...
  - **The old:** Digitized versions of the first print periodicals related to music
    - E.g. *Allgemeine Musikalische Zeitung*
  - ... to:
  - **The new:** Periodicals “born digital,” and incorporating other formats such as audio files
    - E.g. *Echo: A Music-Centered Journal*

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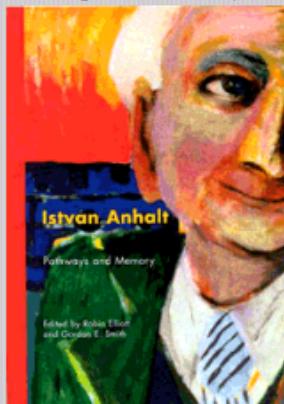

1. The recent Festschrift-style volume, *Istvan Anhalt: Pathways and Memory* (Montréal: McGill-Queen's University Press, 2001), is the most valuable document to date on a major figure in twentieth- and twenty-first-century music, as well as a significant addition to the understanding of the development of current art music in North America, as distinct from the European tradition. It can be argued that Istvan Anhalt is the quintessential Canadian composer: he relates how upon his arrival in Canada in 1949 from Hungary by way of Paris, he

immediately felt very good [t]here. At that time there was no flag, no national anthem that everybody could sing. Also, people made fun of nationalism in those days, which was very refreshing. (34)

This statement is critical not only in understanding Anhalt as a composer, but also to the worldview of an entire generation of composers who endured what can only be described as horror brought on by xenophobia. In view of this, the thoroughly un-patriotic Canada must have seemed like the Promised Land.

2. It may appear ironic that a composer who moved from Europe in his thirties would come to epitomize Canadian music, but in a nation as full of immigrants as Canada is, it is quite normal. American composer George Rochberg claims that Anhalt is "entirely and deeply European," (356) and he refers to Anhalt's attention to detail and care with documentation as evidence of this claim. 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3. Istvan Anhalt was born in 1919 to Jewish parents in Hungary, but never felt at home in his native country. Thus, it is all the more poignant that his search for home would not only lead him to Canada, the immigrant nation par excellence, but would also inflect his music with this search that is in line with the developing Canadian musical aesthetic. Anhalt's eagerness to absorb Canadian culture, both French and English, and his curiosity about trends in American music, both serious and popular, has allowed him to create a panoply of musical references that is neither trivially post-modern nor rigidly modernist. Instead, what he has developed is a musical style that is eclectic in the best sense of the term. It carefully celebrates the achievements of others, dutifully notes much twentieth-century music, resulting in a music that is both pleasant to listen to and filled with references that contemporary listeners can relate to. This example, from his recent [Juno Award](#) winning CD demonstrates the beauty of line that characterises Anhalt's recent orchestral music:

Although he studied with some of the century's greatest teachers, including Zoltán Kodály and Nadia Boulanger, he could neither adopt Kodály's Hungarian nationalist pride, nor share Boulanger's allegiance to Stravinsky. He was, and remains, a broadly learned person, a man for whom there is no container, a composer whose style cannot be described in terms of the traditional stylistic moles of Stravinsky: Schoenberg, acoustic; electro-acoustic, American; European.

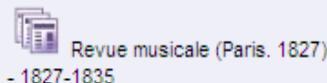
**INTRODUCTION.**

## Titre: Zenith : Revue internationale des arts et de la culture, Numéro 1, février 1921

### Description

Zenit (Zénith) était le premier magazine d'avant-garde publié dans l'ex-Yougoslavie et l'une des plus importantes publications de l'avant-garde européenne au début du 20ème siècle. Lancé en février 1921 par l'artiste Ljubomir Micić (1895-1971), le magazine a été publié sur une base mensuelle à Zagreb et à Belgrade jusqu'en décembre 1926 et son interdiction par les autorités. Plus de 43 numéros ont été publiés au total, ainsi qu'une affiche, "Zenitismus", et un numéro du quotidien *Zenit* datant du 23 septembre 1922. Le zénitisme est un mouvement d'avant-garde né autour de la revue. Le Manifeste zénitiste en juin 1921 se voulait un courant humaniste et aux idéaux pacifistes, et appelait à la création d'une Europe nouvelle et unie. Outre Micić, il y eut d'autres contributeurs importants à la revue *Zenit*, parmi lesquels Miloš Crnjanski, Dušan Matić, Stanislav Vinaver, Pablo Picasso, Alexander Blok, Jaroslav Seifert, Wassily Kandinsky, Vladimir Tatlin, Kazimir Malevich, Tommaso Marinetti, Marc Chagall, Ilya Ehrenburg, et bien d'autres. La collection complète de *Zenit* présentée ici est issue de la collection spéciale de la Bibliothèque Nationale de Serbie, et fait partie du legs de Micić à la bibliothèque.

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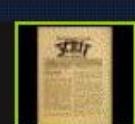


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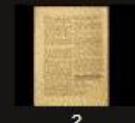

**Joachim at Cambridge.**  
*(From the London "Times.")*

Cambridge, March 8.

The Senate House presented an animated appearance this afternoon, in consequence of the announcement that the honorary degree of Doctor of Music, granted by Grace of the Senate last May to Herr Joachim, would be conferred on that renowned artist. The floor of the building was occupied by members of the Senate and a large number of ladies. The galleries were, as usual assigned to the undergraduates. Two o'clock was the hour fixed for the Congregation, and, with the punctuality usually observed in University proceedings, the Vice-Chancellor, accompanied by the Equerry Bedell, entered, his appearance being greeted with applause. But the observed of all observers was Herr Joachim, who, arrayed in the scarlet robes of a doctor, was quickly recognized. A slight interval occurred in consequence of some formal Graces having to be approved and some supplicants for degrees passed by the Senate, and the impatience of the undergraduates was more than once manifested by insure observations addressed to the officials. The routine business completed, the Public Orator, Mr. J. E. Sandys, of St. John's College, preceded by the Deputy Registrar Bedell, Mr. E. A. Beck, of Trinity Hall, was formally introduced to Herr Joachim, and, advancing about midway up the Senate House, Herr Joachim standing on his right hand, he introduced that gentleman to the Senate in an eloquent Latin speech. At the commencement of the oration, which was delivered throughout in a most effective manner, there were indications on the part of the undergraduates that it would be utterly inaudible except to a favored few, for a running commentary of senseless observations commenced, and some bronze coins were insultingly thrown before the Public Orator. But the good sense of the majority of the undergraduates prevailed over the boisterous conduct of a few, and, after the opening sentence the audience was silent.

Amid deafening plaudita, Herr Joachim was led to the Vice-Chancellor's chair by the Public Orator. Dr. Atkinson rose, and in the usual Latin formulæ admitted him to the title of Doctor in Music.

The rehearsal held to-day at the Guildhall provided a fair opportunity of estimating in some degree the new music prepared for the sides admitted; and if anything were needed to establish the fact, the admirable execution of Brahms' Schicksalslied ("Song of Destiny") which, in honor of the great modern German composer, who was expected to take the degree of "Mus. Doc." in company with his close friend in art, Herr Joachim, and whose absence has caused marked disappointment, is awarded a conspicuous place in the programme of the evening. This remarkable setting of one among the most notable of Hölderlin's poems was made known to English amateurs by Mr. August Manns, exactly two years since, at one of the Crystal Palace Saturday performances, to which we are indebted for so many things that, while deserving all publicity, might still for a long time have remained unknown to us.

The orchestra engaged for this eminently musical celebration, numbering between fifty and sixty executants, the majority from London, is one of irreproachable quality. It comprises ten first violins, headed by Mr. A. Burnett, a thoroughly experienced *chef d'orchestre*; eight second violins, six violas, four violoncellos, four double basses, three trombones, four horns, two trumpets, a contrabassetto (or double bassoon)—an instrument employed by Beethoven in his fifth (C minor) symphony—and, not forgetting drums, the usual complement of "wood." The force, numerically, is quite sufficient for the hall, the sonority and acoustic properties of which will be more satisfactorily tested to-night, when, notwithstanding the high prices of admission (a guinea and half a guinea), an audience is expected that will completely fill it.

The pieces to be heard for the first time this evening are a symphony in C minor, by Herr Brahms, and an overture in G minor, by Herr Joachim, the newly elected "Doctor in Music." The symphony has already been played at Vienna, where it is criticized in diverse manners, but, on the whole, warmly eulogized. The overture, written expressly for the occasion, may stand for Herr Joachim's credentials, just as the "Oxford Symphony," once familiarly

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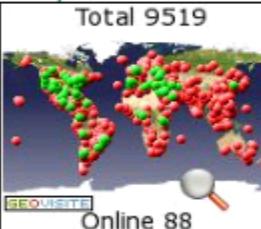
